
# Intro to Driving Derby Competitions


## **Driving Derby Overview**

- Course consists of cones (6 16 pairs) + marathon-type obstacles (min of 2, max of 4)
- A "round" is a <u>timed run</u> through the course (timed from Start to Finish) Each competitor performs the course one or more times (usually twice)
- Penalties are given as seconds and added to the times for the rounds
- When the course is ready, the official will give the driver a **signal to start** (do not start before the signal or you'll incur a 10 sec penalty and have to restart!)
- Gaits: Any gait (walk, trot, canter) except no cantering in Training level




## Course – Marathon Obstacles


- Marathon obstacles have "gates" with letters (A, B, C, D, E)
  - Must go through each gate in the <u>correct order</u> (A, then B, then C, etc.)
  - Must go through each gate in the <u>correct direction</u> as indicated by the colored letters (always "red on right")
- After each gate has been driven, it becomes "open"
- There are no official entrance/exit gates to each obstacle
- To correct a course error: drive through the missed gate before continuing the remaining gates in the correct order




## Course - Cones

- Cone pairs are numbered (1, 2, 3, etc.)
  - Must go through each pair of cones ("gates") in the <u>correct order</u> (1, then 2, then 3, etc.)
  - Must go through each pair of cones in the <u>correct direction</u> as indicated by the colored numbers (always "red on right")
- Each pair of cones can only be driven once, in numeric order
- After each pair of cones has been driven, it stays "live" (elimination if you drive through again this is different from gates in a hazard)
- You <u>cannot correct</u> a cones course error (penalty: elimination)








## **Turnout**

• Carriage: Marathon-type carriage or cart with iron or solid rubber tires is encouraged (but not required).

• Attire: Marathon-type attire is appropriate.

Harness: Bridle must have noseband;
 breeching required for all single turnouts & all carriages without brakes.





- Groom/navigator: Required for all except single VSE and single Small Pony.
- Whip required.

## **Derby Scoring**

- ALL SCORES ARE IN SECONDS (not points)
- Penalties are in seconds (not points)
- Score for one round = (a) + (b)
  - (a) Total time to complete the course (from START to FINISH)
  - (b) Penalties
- Final competitor score is the sum of scores for all rounds
- Lowest time (score) wins!

#### Example:

Round 1		Round 2		Total
Time	Penalties	Time	Penalties	Time
1:37	:20	1:18	:05	3:20

## **Types of Penalties**

- 1. Time added to score
- 2. Just time lost
- 3. Elimination



## Penalties: Time Added to Score

Description of Violation	Penalty
A dislodged element is knocked down by any means (e.g., ball down from a cone)	5 seconds
Causing an obstacle to be rebuilt (clock stops); added to penalty for dislodged element	5 seconds
Starting before the signal from the official	10 seconds
Dismounting while carriage is in motion	10 seconds
Corrected course in marathon obstacle	20 seconds
Groom uses the reins, whip or the brake	20 seconds
Cantering for more than 3 seconds in Training (walk/trot) division per occurrence	20 seconds

No Penalties: Just Time Lost

- First or second disobedience
- Groom(s) or Driver intentionally dismounting, first or second time
- Groom(s) or Driver intentionally dismounting and remounting <u>before</u> next numbered gate or finish

## Penalties: Elimination! "the big



- Failing to pass through start or finish gates
- Course error in cones: Numbered cones obstacle driven backwards, out of order, or more than once
- Course error in marathon obstacle not corrected
- Third disobedience
- Groom not on carriage when passing Finish Line
- Groom(s) or Driver intentionally dismounting for third time
- Failure to dismount to repair broken harness
- Groom(s) or Driver intentionally dismounting and remounting <u>after</u> next numbered gate or the Finish Line
- The carriage does not halt for a groom or driver remount.
- Driver unintentional dismount
- Carriage turnover
- Excessive use of whip
